Commander's Message

Greetings American Legion post 245 members and families;

If you missed our March meeting and dinner, you missed a good one. We had delicious corned beef and cabbage cooked up by Doug and Judy Deaton and Debbie Niebuhr. Our guest speaker group was led by Charles Konsitzke of UW Biotechnology and they shared stories of their ongoing efforts to identify the remains of servicemembers missing in action around the world. They have researched battles in certain regions, matched DNA with family members, sifted through earth, and have been instrumental in returning the remains of over 1500 of the over 82,000 MIAs still unaccounted for. These volunteer undergrad students and Charles work tirelessly and it was inspiring to hear the stories, and see these young people find such meaning in their service.

The February Draw down and the March pancake breakfast were both very successful events thanks to many volunteers, and Dave Montag has been opening the downstairs bar on Thursday afternoons from 3:00 until 6:00pm, and this too has been quite a local hit.

We decided at the March Executive meeting that changing to an electronic version only of this newsletter won't occur until June as there are important mailings that have to take place before then. The 245er then will only be available by visiting our website <u>americanlegioncp.org</u> and clicking on the newsletter tab.

We decided to have another Draw Down event this coming November, and keep it annually in the fall as in the past. Bill Statz has graciously volunteered to head this again.

As you will read in Dennis's minutes, we voted to increase annual membership dues to 45 dollars per year in keeping with increases in department and national charges. The portion of your annual dues which trickles to our post is a modest one, and while we hate to see cost increases, we hope your annual dues are a value to sustain this organization and what it stands for.

On the subject of membership, our First Vice Emily Cash is away at a military school currently, and hasn't been able to solicit membership dues payment. As a district we are currently at 95.3%, first place in the state. Dane county has five posts which are at 100%+ already. Our post 245 is at 92.82% with 168 members paid up and only 13 members who need to renew so that we too can be at100%. Please go on line or mail in your dues.

At the Dane county meeting last week in Marshall, Commander Scott Klassy Gaveled in and at one point introduced Department Vice Commander Jim Johnson who reminded us to continue to be visible in our community by proudly wearing our AL uniform items at public functions, look in on one another from time to time by calling members who may be alone and in need of a buddy check, and the importance of staying relevant in our communities.

I am very much looking forward to the Dane County Government Youth Day to take place at Post 360 in Waunakee on April 18th. This event headed by Shirley Kubiac is a terrific way to show local middle schoolers the role of, and opportunities in County government. Chaperones are Legionnaires, Sons, and Auxiliary who have volunteered. Bill Statz is our point of contact again this year if you are interested in volunteering.

Many of our members and family who winter in southern climates will be returning in April, and it will be nice to reunite at our meeting on April 18th. There will be much to discuss, hope to see you there.
