American Legion Post 245, Auxilary, SAL and TDS send packages to the Troops

TDS currently has a Patriot's group of Veterans and employees who are concerned with Veteran issues. Recently they became aware of a Wisconsin Army National Guard Unit B Company 248th that were not scheduled to receive any Christmas Packages while they were overseas.

Once I heard about it I contacted Ed Pelowsky and Carol Yttri and we decided that we would work with the TDS Patriot's group and we would donate \$650.00 towards the items that were suggested that they needed.

With the money I went shopping and we contributed signed Christmas Cards and the following items:

Then all of a sudden people in line started clapping, cheering and asking questions about the troops.

Not only did this make us proud of our members of the Military, but also of the amazing generous people who donated from TDS, American Legion Post 2415, their Auxiliary and Son's of The American Legion.
