Changes to the Flag Program

We will put out the flags on Memorial Day, May 26th. We will not pick them up until the evening of Veterans Day, Nov. 11th. We will be putting out 366 flags this year and are in the need of extra legionnaires or SAL members to help. I will be contacting the flag route people with some new additions to their route.

Sharing Letter from Bill Statz to Executive Committee:

To: Post 245 Executive Committee April 26, 2025 From: Bill Statz Subject: Announcement of Retirement

Due to health and personal reasons, I am stepping down from all American Legion offices and committees, Post and County, effective May 15, 2025.

I will assist in actively recruiting other Legionnaires to pick up the tasks that I have been doing. I will also be available to train and hand off all the details and materials for each task. Listed below are the items that I have been doing in recent years, along with a short write up of what is entailed. Some of them were not being done at Post 245, or hadn't been done for some time, and some may not continue if we don't have volunteers step up. Perhaps recruiting someone to step up and take over individual items will be less daunting to new volunteers than taking over everything.

May I suggest that we publish this list and information in the May newsletter, and beyond until all positions are filled, or discontinued.

Need volunteers to do:

1. Americanism, all inclusive, or do just one or two of the following:

- a. Legion Baseball. Easy to do, just coordinate with the coach/team on schedule, Post funding, special events, volunteer opportunities, host them at a Post meeting.
- b. Badger Boys State. Do sponsorship cards for Post 245 and send to Department. Department then sends sponsorship cards to Middleton High School. The High School takes care of recruiting and selecting our 3 boys. Our contact is the Counselor at the High School, she does a good job. Makes this job easy for the Legion. Follow up to have the boys attend our August meeting to report on their experience at BBS.
- c. Legion Oratorical Scholarship Contest. Study the program to understand it, start to finish, etc. Then need to seek out and recruit candidates. The Counselors at the High School advise the entire Junior & Counselors and this opportunity. We have 2

potential candidates already lined up for 2025/2026 competition. Be the advisor to candidates, sign up at Department, track preparation progress. Set up the Post level Contest. Attend competitions at County, District and Department, depending on far our candidate goes, etc.

- d. Dane County Youth Government Day. This is a County led event. At our Post level, contact the 3 schools we sponsor, they have all participated in the past, know the program. Compile information from the schools and submit to the County, along with Post 245 check for lunches. We share buses with Wisconsin Heights, need to arrange with Black Earth and Mazomanie Legion Posts. Accompany students on the day of as a chaperone for one of the schools, and/or recruit others, one Legionnaire per school.
- e. Best of Awards. The American Legion Department of Wisconsin has the annual Awards program. There are a combined total of 30 Awards for the Best of: Americanism, Employment, Public Safety, and Additional Awards. The goal is to identify outstanding people in our Post 245 Legion Family, and community, who are exceptional performers. Then, with their support, solicit and compile all documentation for the application.

This year, we focused on the Public Safety Awards, with candidates for EMT of the Year, National Guard Soldier of the Year, and Law Enforcement Officer of the Year.

- 2. Community Outreach, Recruiting Table. Set up the Post 245 table with Post table banner, and Legion brochures for all Legion programs. Can also request to use pull-up banners from our Department Vice Commander. Suggested events to attend, listed in order through the year, can include but not limited to: a) Memorial Day at the Post, b) National Night Out in Cross Plains, and c) in Middleton, d) Cross Plains Community event at Fire House, e) Good Neighbor Festival in Middleton, f) Halloween event at Legion, g) Dane County Sheriff's Department Veterans Shoot in Waunakee.
- 3. Draw Down Raffle fundraiser. This is a major event, and takes a lot of pre-planning, getting tickets printed, raffle license, and full-bore effort to get all 300 tickets distributed, tracked, sold by Legion Family members, collect stubs and money/deposit, and compile list of ticket holders, etc. Arrange for date and reserve hall and meal prep and worker list and recruit workers, coordinate with SAL and Auxiliary on details, etc.
- 4. Sergeant at Arms. This is an elected office at the Post, there are 2 Sgt at Arms. It is a 2 year term, elections in even number years. Are halfway through the current term, ending May 2026. Appoint candidate to finish this term. Currently other Sgt at Arms is Dick Zwettler.
 - a. Dick is currently arranging for the Honor Guard and rifle squad for funerals. But if Dick is not available, need to run the funeral service at churches and/or cemetery.
 - b. Arrange for color guards on request for: High School functions/football game, Honor flights, special events, etc.
 - c. Memorial Day. Assist Dick as needed, march the Guard at cemeteries, marching in the parade, and assist at Memorial service.
 - d. As one of the 11 elected officers for the Post, serve on the Executive Committee, and assist at the monthly meetings per Sgt at Arms protocol.
